

# Bunny Sewing Instructions

*Sewing Level: 2*

## Sewing Supplies

- Faux fur fabric (not too thick)
- Felt matching the faux fur
- Velvet for inside of ears
- Scrap of leather/suede for pads and nose

¼" (6 mm) seam allowance included throughout

- Sewing thread, matching the faux fur
- Assorted embroidery threads – see booklet
- Stuffing/Wadding
- Handsewing needle

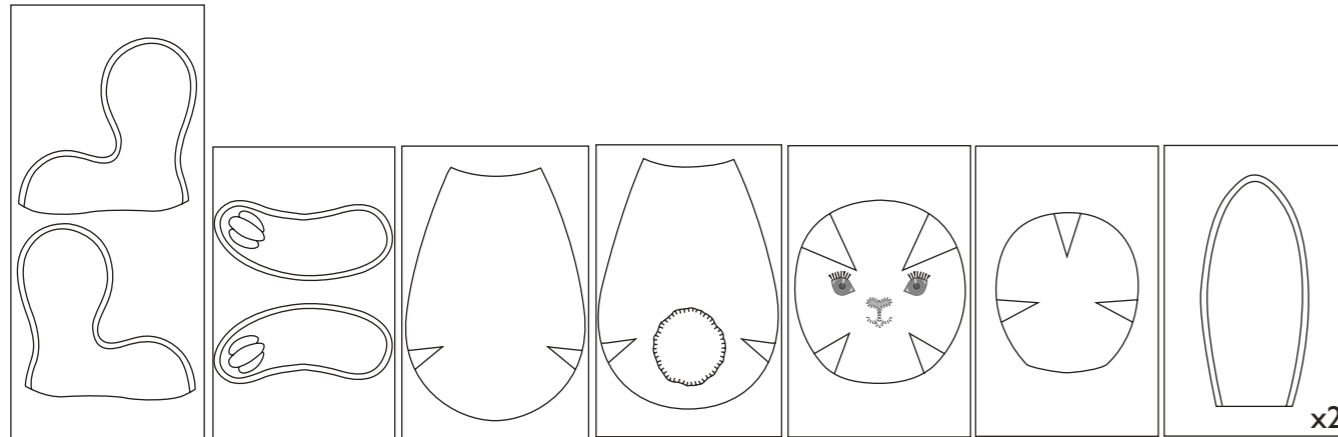
## Husqvarna Viking Accessories

- Tear A Way™ stabilizer
- Quilter's ¼" Piecing Foot (412 78 55-45)
- Water-Soluble Stabilizer (for Bunnys heart)



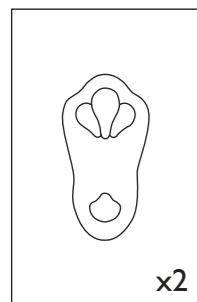
## Cutting Scheme

### Faux Fur Fabric



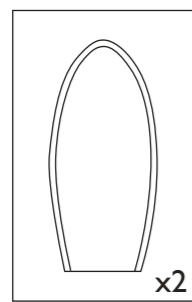
Mega Hoop 360x150 mm / 14.2x6"

## Embroider

All Bunny body parts are created with appliqué technique, therefore hoop only Tear-A-Way™ stabilizer.

Embroider the first color, an outline is stitched to show where to place the fabric.

Place the fabric on top of the outline and continue embroidering. When the embroidery is finished, cut out the piece along the outer seam line (head and body parts only have one seam).

Make sure to always place the fur pieces in the same direction.

Repeat for each body part.

### Embroider Legs and Ears

The legs and ears are sewn together in the hoop. When inserting the appliqué, place the two layers of leg/ear fabric right sides together on top of the stitched outline.

When continue embroidering, the two fabric layers are sewn together. Outside the joining seam an outline is stitched showing where to cut the piece out.

### Embroider the Arms

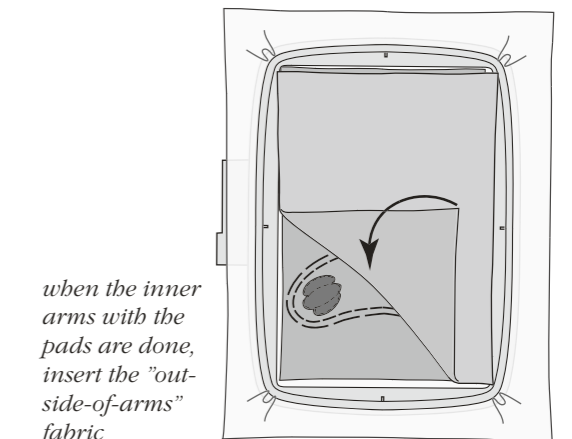
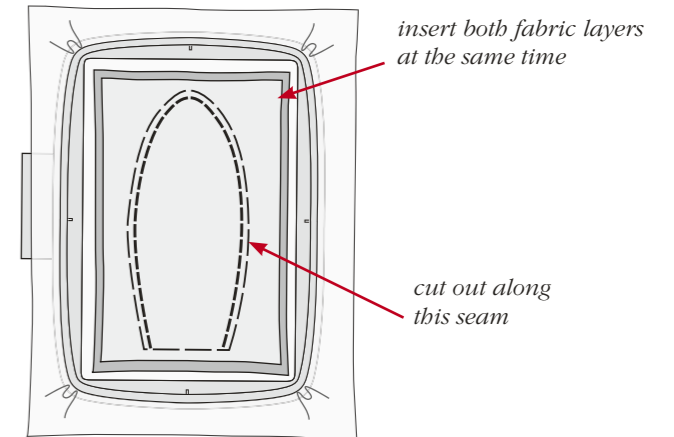
The arms are made in two steps. First the inside of the arms are sewn, the pads are made as an appliqué.

Carefully remove the hoop and trim around the pads.

Insert the hoop again, place the fabric for the outside of the arms right sides together with the inner arms fabric. Continue embroidering to sew the arms together. Outside the joining seam an outline is stitched showing where to cut the piece out.

When all body parts are finished, remove the stabilizer and cut out the pieces along the outer stitch line.

**Tip:** When embroidering on thick fabrics, we recommend using the optional Sensor Q-Foot (4125975-45). It is designed especially for use on thick or spongy fabric.



## Sewing

Rethread your machine with sewing thread on top and in the bobbin. Snap on Quilter's 1/4" Piecing Foot. When sewing, use a 6 mm seam allowance.

### Arms

Turn the arms right sides out. Stuff the arms and sew the opening closed by hand.

### Legs

Pin the paw pads right sides together with the legs and stitch all around the paw pads.

Turn the legs right sides out. Stuff the legs and sew the opening closed by hand.

### Body

Fold the darts. Sew along the dart marking.

Trim the seam along the stitch marking.

Place the front and back pieces of the body right sides together. Sew them together but leave the "neck" open.

**Tip:** Tuck in the fur between the two layers when you sew the pieces together for a better result and an invisible seam.

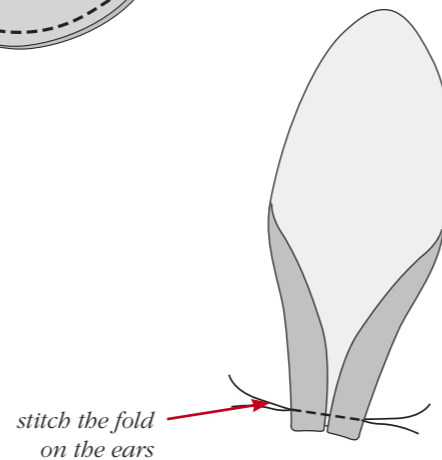
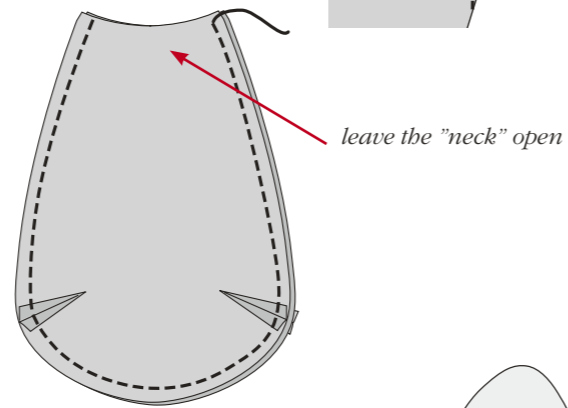
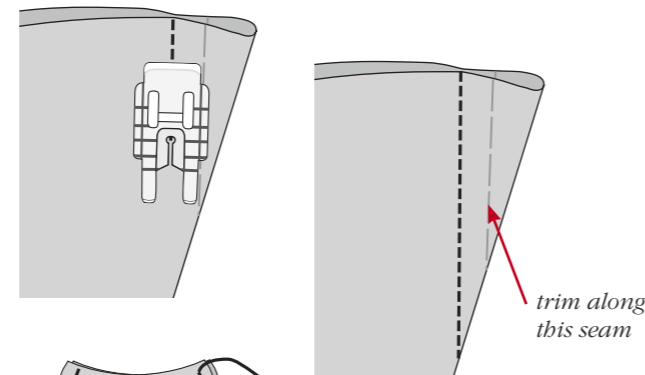
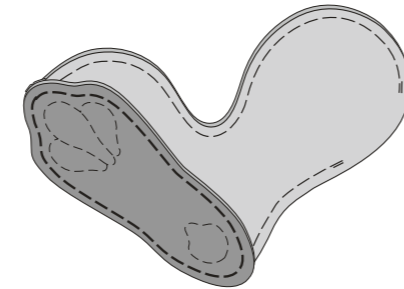
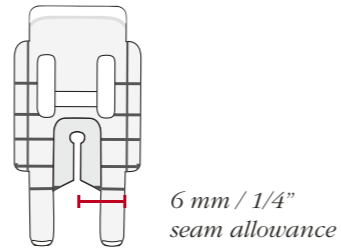
Stuff the body properly.

### Ears

Turn the ears right sides out.

Fold the bottom of the ears towards the middle as illustrated.

Stitch the folded edge to hold it in place.



### Head

Cut the eyelashes open from the wrong side of fabric, as illustrated.

Fold the darts on the front and back head piece. Sew along the dart marking.

Trim outside the seam along the stitched marking.

Place the ears right sides together with the Bunnys face. The middle of the ear should be placed over the darts.

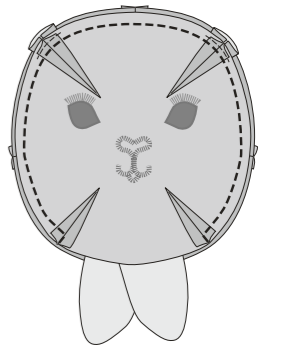
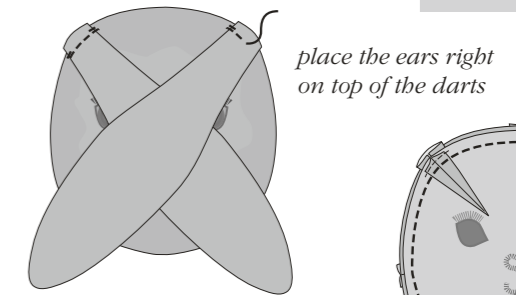
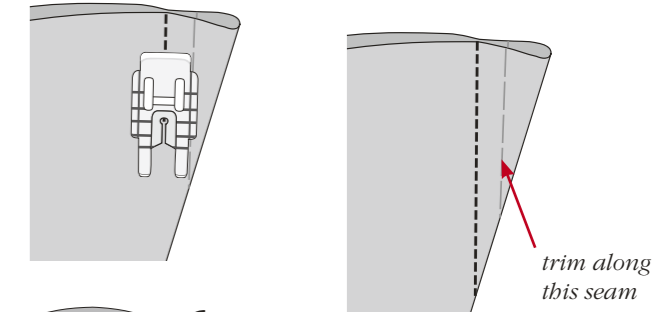
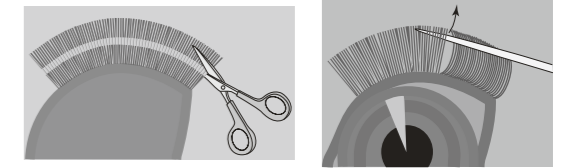
Stitch to fasten the ears to the face.

Place the front and back pieces of the head right sides together, let the ears protrude through the "neck". Sew the pieces together until you reach the darts on the front head piece.

Be careful not to catch the ears in the seam when sewing.

**Tip:** Tuck in the fur between the two layers when you sew the pieces together for a better result and an invisible seam.

Turn the head right sides out and stuff. Form the head by pushing the stuffing out in the nose.



## Assemble

To give your Bunny a soul, place her heart inside the body.

Place the head on the body and sew head and body together by hand. Before finishing the seam, put in some extra stuffing to make the neck more stable.

Fasten the legs and arms to the body as illustrated using a heavy-weight sewing thread.

Stitch through the arms/legs and then in the body. Tighten carefully and repeat a few times.

Wind the thread a few turns around the seam as when sewing on a button with a shank.

Fasten the thread thoroughly. Your Bunny can now move her arms and legs.
